

Born in Bern, Switzerland in 1972, **Bernhard Gerber** studied Medicine at the University of Zurich and the University of Bern. He graduated in 2000 winning the award for the best performance at the Medical School, University of Bern. He wrote his MD thesis on 'Differences between synthetic oligosaccharide immunoabsorbents in depletion capacity for xenoreactive anti-Gal α 1-3Gal antibodies from human serum' in 2001. After internships in surgery, general internal medicine, intensive care, hematology and cardiology, he first specialized in general internal medicine in 2006 and later in clinical and laboratory hematology in 2012. He received the *Venia legendi* from the University of Zürich for his research activity in the field of supportive care in hematology in 2019. His main clinical research interest are plasma cell diseases and lymphoproliferative disorders, as well as systemic amyloidosis. He currently is deputy head physician at the Clinic of Hematology, Istituto Oncologico della Svizzera Italiana (IOSI), Bellinzona. He is founder of the Amyloidosis Network Zurich and of the Amyloidosis Registry, and founder of the Swiss Amyloidosis Network. Bernhard Gerber is married and has one daughter.
